
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
Lesson 4 More Hitches

First, show your Chief that you can tie the hitches from last meeting.


Now let's learn two more. For the most secure hold (but still easy to remove) use the **Two Half Hitch**:

Go all the way around a post, tree branch, dock piling, or ring. This way it won't get too tight!





The **Taut Line Hitch** is great for camping, when you want to adjust your tent lines to keep everything nice and tight. Just slide the knot to wherever you need to adjust the length and tighten its pull.





Wow! You have learned 9 knots so far with only one more to go!! Be sure to practice each knot and Proverbs 6:20-21 before next meeting. Also, memorize <u>Matthew 18:18</u>: "Whatsoever ye bind on earth shall be bound in heaven. Whatsoever ye loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven."
